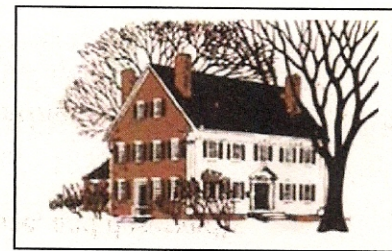

Earlier this year, the Woodstock History Center in Woodstock, Vermont co-hosted a program by Gary Anderson entitled "Clarence Darrow: The Search for Justice." That performance was one of the highlights of our 2009 program series.
